

THE HAYDON HUNDRE

Saturday 15th June

The Haydon Hundred is a sportive running in the South Tyne Valley in South West Northumberland. The 3 routes include a 100km main route with several unique features including climbing the Alston cobbles and crossing Alston and Allendale Moors. The 60km Challenge route is designed for the less experienced cyclist. Still tough but at less than 40 miles it is accessible to any reasonably fit cyclist. Finally the 140km, expert only, Skyrider route climbs 5 of the 6 highest roads in England giving a massive 2700 metres of vertical for the day.

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

MEETING OF HAYDON PARISH COUNCIL AT 7PM ON APRIL 2019, AT LANGLEY VILLAGE HALL.

- Present : Cllrs J. Bates, E. Charlton, E. Faulks, B. Howard, J. Keyte, K. Richardson, A. Sharp, R. Snowdon J. Thompson and D. Thornhill; C. McGivern (mins.), public.
- 1. Public participation None
- **2.** Brian Howard and Jonathan Keyte were co-opted onto the Parish Council, and the Chair welcomed them.
- **3. Apologies** were received from Cllrs Burrows and Kirsopp.
- 4. Declarations of interest None received.
- 5. Minutes of the previous meeting having been circulated, were agreed and signed.
- 6. Report from Northumberland County Council -

Cllr Sharp thanked all of those who attended the meeting to discuss the results of a consultation on Ratcliffe Road. There had been agreement on the following points and they would go ahead –

- Bus stop opposite the Community Centre to remain where it is.
- Priority from Ratcliffe Road onto Church Street, give way system on the bridge.
- No parking on the bridge.
- Reinstating the pedestrian crossing at current location.
- Pedestrian crossing outside the Co-op.
- Loading bays outside the pharmacy and Claire's newsagents.

A compromise of 3 or 4 passing places was agreed for Ratcliffe Road, and this would give an extra 10 parking places instead of 14. An additional bus stop is planned at Innerhaugh Mews. There is £30,000 in the pot and Cllr Sharp will top this up if necessary to deliver the project. The island at the end of Church Street will be removed. Cllr Snowdon agreed to write a piece for the Haydon News, with the agreement of NCC. Cllr Thornhill said that he had been concerned to hear at the end of the meeting that "the re-designation of the road would have to go to the topological team." Other Cllrs shared this concern. Cllr Sharp promised to ask the Deputy Chief Exec about this on the following day. It was thought that the passing places would be marked with double yellow lines. There had been a meeting with Karbon Homes, as Cllr Sharp was frustrated about the situation regarding the garages. Some people had received a letter about

Cllr Charlton said that planning application for this site had passed subject to the flood report from the EA. This was supposed to be discussed at the public meeting which was cancelled due to Brexit.

They cannot proceed until the flood report has been received. Cllr Charlton reminded everyone that the gardens on the estate had been flooded by water from the drains during Storm Desmond. Cllr Sharp said that he agreed with the points put to the Conservation Officer about the new build on North Bank. The owners had told neighbours that the Conservation Officer had suggested the zinc roof. It was noted that the building could be seen from as far away as Lowgate. The problems with water on the road at Tofts cottages was an issue for NWL, they have been asked to deal with it. Cllr Bates confirmed that there is still an issue with litter on the A686.

7. Highways –

- a) A letter had been received from Mrs Rooke. Cars are parking on the road around the bend and this forces drivers into the middle of the road, and they cannot see what traffic is coming. It was agreed that the Clerk would request that NCC writes to the residents in this area. NCC has marked "slow" on the road at various points.
- b) Lands' End Road Cllr Kirsopp had spoken to the contractor, and Cllr Bates confirmed that work had been done to improve the concrete area. It was unclear whether the verge had been reinstated.
- c) Cllr Charlton said that a list of potholes on the Haydon Hundred route had been sent to NCC.
- 8. Lighting There are some orange lights still in place.
- 9. Planning applications –

19/00805/CCD - Haydon Parish Council SUPPORTS this application, as they are delighted to see investment in the school.

Cllr Charlton said that the tennis courts had already been moved, and it was hoped that this would relieve



parking problems on North Bank. Cllr Bates asked whether the tennis courts would still be accessible to children in the village. Cllr Charlton said that the Shaftoe Trust and the PC had put money into the sports hall and they should still be accessible to all. Cllr Keyte agreed to raise this point with the school.

10. Accounts – As in budget.

The Clerk handed over the receipts & payments book, bank statements and invoices to the Chair for checking as part of the audit process.

The **risk assessment and review of internal audit** documents were circulated and agreed by the 31st of March 2019.

The Chair explained the recent difficulties with contacting the Cemetery Maintenance Person. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to ask him to provide a reliable means of communication. Alan Batey will be asked to cut the grass to get it back into a decent state. The Clerk said that when graves had been re-opened recently soil and stones had been left on surrounding graves. Cllr Sharp will raise this with the grave diggers.

11. Correspondence – nothing further to report.

12. Parish projects –

- a) Development Trust Cllr Charlton said that this year's Haydon Hundred event will take place on the 15th of June. The stencils have now been made for the stones to be placed at either end of the village.
- b) Neighbourhood Plan Cllr Charlton said that an initial drop-in event had been held for the public. Six volunteers had taken away all of the comments, to put them into order. The outcome of this will be discussed at a meeting on the 15th of May. Some people had asked for things that had already been supplied in the village, and it was felt that another public event would be needed. Carole Price will write a piece for the Haydon News. It is hoped that two documents will be created by the N Plan process. One will be a blueprint for the future, to help with applying for funding and the other the legal document relating to planning issues.
- c) Riverside Ms Gibson had met with Alan Batey. Cllr Faulks said that they needed a clerk of works to oversee the work on site and Cllr Howard agreed to meet with those concerned. He will also liaise with Cllr Thornhill to assess the trees. Cllr Sharp confirmed that there was a legal requirement for the PC to check the trees on their land. It was noted that Greenwich Hospital Estates have already checked the listed trees on this site.

- d) Flooding The planned EA public meeting had been cancelled, due to Brexit planning. At the meeting in March representatives of NWL and NCC had been expected to attend, but had not. Cllr Snowdon said that he was becoming annoyed and frustrated by the poor communication on this subject. He had written to invite representatives of the EA, NCC and NWL to a meeting on the 9th of May. Sarah Darling had replied to confirm that someone from the EA would attend. Cllr Snowdon also said that a drone survey was being carried out of the gravel at Lipwood.
- e) Village spring clean ClIr Charlton suggested the May bank holiday weekend for the spring clean. ClIr Bates will talk to the school about possible involvement.
- f) Wood edging at Shaftoe Green Alan Batey had pointed out some wood edging that needed to be replaced. The Handyman felt that the whole of Shaftoe Green needed to be examined. He had pointed out that it holds the woodchip in place around play equipment. One suggestion was to remove the steps and just have the ramp instead of both. It was agreed that builders would be approached to request quotes for the work.
- g) Green dog walkers scheme Cllr Snowdon had written a piece on dog fouling for the Haydon News, edited by Cllr Bates. Cllr Bates wondered if it might be possible to have a village event for dog owners and pass on information about the scheme. The Clerk will investigate the purchase of poo bag dispensers. Cllr Thornhill said that the last nine times that he had been to Shaftoe Green there had been no dog dirt at all.

13. Any other business -

- a) Cllr Richardson said that Cllr Kirsopp had asked about the seats on the approach to Spa Well, as they are damaged. The Handyman will investigate.
- b) Cllr Richardson said that a member of the public had asked what was happening about the frontage of the old antique shop. She was told that the owner had replaced the windows, only to have one broken the next day. He is unwilling to bear the expense of replacement at the moment, in case this happens again.
- c) Bottle banks ClIr Richardson asked if there was another location for the bottle banks. ClIr Charlton said that this site had been mentioned in the Haydon News, and nearby residents had been unhappy about the proposal. ClIr Charlton said that she had been told that the glass waste was being added to the normal waste stream, rather than recycled. ClIr Sharp promised to investigate this.
- d) Cllr Charlton said that the Community Association had got an estimate for security doors and had asked for Cllr Sharp to contact them to discuss a Community Chest grant. Cllr Sharp will be in touch with them.







HISTORICAL NOTES OF HAYDON BRIDGE

RETAIL THERAPY - Continued from May 2019

In May's Haydon News, I followed an earlier Historical Notes' article ('Retail Therapy 1900s Style' - Haydon News October 2018) with an examination of the Barron family's Grocery, Confectionary and Baker's shop at 4 John Martin Street. This month, I take a closer look at the history of Todds' retail business at 4 Shaftoe Street.



Todd's Provision Merchant at Haydon Bridge

On August 5th 1803, Joseph Todd and Barbara Heppel were married at Warden. Joseph was a farmer at Great Whittington and they had eight children: Joseph, twins Mary and Elizabeth, William, Charlton, Jane, Sarah and Margaret. Our Haydon Bridge story concerns two of the brothers, William and Joseph Todd.

Family line: William Todd to William Kirsop Todd.

William Todd married Jane Dixon at Warden in 1840, Jane was the daughter of Christopher and Ann Dixon of Warden. By 1851, William and Jane are living at Haydon Bridge with their son William Kirsop Todd. William Kirsop was born on May 22nd 1847 and baptised in the Presbyterian Chapel at Haydon Bridge. Two of William and Jane's earlier children, Ann (1841) and Jane Ann (1844) had died at two weeks and at four years old. In 1851, William is recorded as a 'Master



Tailor'.

In 1861, the family were living at 4 Shaftoe Street where William Todd was, by now, a grocer and postman; this signalled a marked change in his occupation and was the

By 1871, the family could afford to employ Ann Graham as a house servant and the family were still at number 4 where William was the grocer, but no longer listed as a postman. His son William Kirsop Todd was, however, recorded as a 'Rural Post Messenger'.

earliest days of our Shaftoe Street grocers.

William Todd, who had been the first of the Shaftoe Street 'Todd' grocers, died on April 7th 1876.

Following William's death, his widow Jane, with her son William Kirsop Todd, continued to run the grocer's shop on Shaftoe Street and she was still there in 1881, along with William Kirsop, William's wife Alice and their son Henry Howard who was born on 30th January 1875.

William Kirsop Todd had married Alice (nee) Howard at Newcastle in October 1874. Alice was a daughter of Thos and Lydia Howard of Brighton, Sussex and had been working as a housemaid at Haydon Bridge's parsonage, for the Church of England Priest Wm. Leeman Landered.

In the 1881 census, William Kirsop Todd is recorded as a 'Grocer and Letter Carrier' and by 1891, was running the grocer's shop and was also a postman. William and Alice Todd's fifteen year old son, Henry Howard Todd, was a grocer's apprentice, and William's seventy five year old mother Jane, was still working in the shop.

Jane Todd (nee Dixon) died in February 1900, and the monumental inscription to Jane and her husband William reads:

In affectionate remembrance of William Todd of Haydon Bridge who died 7th April 1876 aged 67 years also of Jane his wife who departed this life on February 23rd 1900 aged 84 years.

The first in a line of our Todd grocers on Shaftoe Street, were no more.

HISTORICAL NOTES OF HAYDON BRIDGE

Dennis Telford

It seems that William Kirsop Todd and his wife Alice Todd continued to run the business at 4 Shaftoe Street, at least until May 1912 when William Kirsop Todd retired after forty five years behind the counter. His retirement was short lived, however, and he died on 27th March 1915. William Kirsop Todd's widow, Alice, passed away on February 2nd 1919.

As William Kirsop's and Alice's son Henry Howard had died on March 22nd 1918, the direct line from William Todd, our first Shaftoe Street grocer, ended in 1919 with Alice's death. To continue following the story we have to return to William's brother Joseph Todd, and thereafter to Joseph's great grandson, Robert R. Todd.

Family line: Joseph Todd to Robert (Bobby) Todd.

Joseph and Hannah Todd married in 1845 and by 1851 they were living at Haydon Bridge with their son William aged six. In 1861, Joseph and Hannah were living down Pandon (Temple Houses) with another son, Joseph Jnr., who was born May 9th 1852. Joseph Snr., was a railway signalman maybe the first of the Todd family to be employed on the Newcastle and Carlisle Railway; a career that became a family tradition.

In 1871, Joseph and Hannah's son Joseph, worked as a grocer's cart man at Humshaugh and in 1896 he married Harriet Ridley who was the step-daughter of Walter and Ann Jackson of Page Croft. Harriet had been working as a domestic servant for Redman Sifton, curate of Haydon Bridge church. Joseph was the second member of the Todd family - after William Kirsop Todd - to marry the servant of a priest/curate.

By the year 1881, Joseph and Harriet Todd were living at Dale Cottage, Haydon Bridge with their sons James (4) who later inherits the grocer's shop at 4 Shaftoe Street -Mary Hannah (3) (Who also takes over the Shaftoe Street shop) and Joseph William (10 months). Three more children followed: Charlotte Ann, Charles and John. In 1881, their father Joseph was recorded as a 'Railway Signalman', and in 1891 James was a fourteen year old 'Railway Lamplighter'.

By 1901, Joseph and Harriet Todd were living at 8 Church Street, with Mary Hannah, Joseph William and John. Mary Hannah was a restaurant waitress and Joseph Wm. a railway porter. Their son James was learning his trade, working at Tanfield, Co., Durham as a railway signalman.

Joseph Todd died at 2 Alexandra Terrace on December 10th 1910, leaving his estate to be administered by his son James.




In 1911, Joseph's widow Harriett still lived at Alexandra Terrace with James (34) who was a railway signalman, Mary Hannah (33) a café manageress, Joseph William (30) a railway porter, Charlotte Ann (27) and John (21) a clerk in railway advertising.

In 1914, James married Margaret Carrick, daughter of Robert and Jane Carrick of West Elrington and they had two children; Robert R. Todd (Bobby) in 1915 and in 1921, Dorothy.

You will recall that Alice Todd - the wife of William Kirsop Todd of Shaftoe Street - had died in 1919. There is no certainty as to when Alice had retired from the Shaftoe Street business after taking it over from husband William and, therefore, it isn't clear when, *or even if*, James Todd took over; although it is clear that Alice left her estate to be 'cared for' by James Todd.

When I was younger, I have a clear recollection that the shop was called 'Hannah Todd's' by older Haydonians and there is no doubt that at some stage - later than 1911 - James's sister Mary Hannah, who died in 1954, was the Todd family member in charge and behind the counter. What is without doubt, is that from 1932, Robert - or as he is remembered with fondness today, 'Bobby' Todd the son of James and Margaret Todd, was the friendly grocer who ran his family's store with his sister Dorothy at number 4 Shaftoe Street, until retiring after forty six years in 1978. The grocery business had been in the Todd family and served our community from 4 Shaftoe Street for around one hundred and twenty years.

HISTORICAL NOTES (Cont'd) Dennis Telford

LOOKING BACK

For one reason or another, William Lee omitted from his 1876 'Historical Notes' publication, some of the observations he had recorded. (See HN May 2019) I continue here, my edited version of his omissions and my own jottings, recorded from various sources.

1697: A Latin inscription was cut out on a large flat stone and placed in the wall of the porch of the Haydon Bridge Grammar School. (*The stone can be seen today in the east wall of Shaftoe Trust School.*)

'This school was founded and liberally endowed in the year of our Lord 1697, by the Reverend and most learned John Shaftoe, Master of Arts, Vicar of Nether Warden, in this County. Nothing is needed in praise of so generous a person, this work alone will speak for all his other benevolent acts.'

1739 December 21st: At Haydon Bridge, a great frost began and a prodigious storm of snow fell from Saturday December 29th until February 18th 1740.

1749: A Bill for vesting land in the Barony of Langley, and other Derwentwater estates for the benefit of the Greenwich Hospital, received Royal assent.

1753 August 25th: A fire broke out in the dwelling house of Thomas Forster, a merchant of Haydon Bridge, which burnt with such fierceness it consumed five dwelling houses. Two days after the fire, Forster, having been suspected as the incendiary, was found in an out-house near the 'Old Sun', with his throat cut. (*Where was the 'Old Sun', I wonder?*)

1771 January 26th: The ancient market cross was moved down from Haydon Church to Haydon Bridge on this day. A market was held and a great many necessities for the relief of the poor were for sale, including many different varieties of grain, which was found most beneficial to those living in the neighbourhood.

1771 November 17th: the great River Tyne flood flowed over the whole village this morning. (*For the full story, see my Historical Notes in The HN of November 2011.*)

A VIEW FROM UP THERE

John Harrison

It's good to see variations on fund-raising for local churches – most of us must have seen variations on the eye-catching church-roof thermometer which informs all who pass by how much more cash is needed to finish the job. I now hear that a Methodist chapel has decided to organise a poetry competition on the theme of the chapel carpet. Unfortunately the means of advertising this leaves much to be desired – the notice read "Those wishing to do something on the church carpet please come forward and collect a piece of paper from Doris McPherson the chapel secretary".

There were two short wet spells at the beginning and end of April, otherwise it was a remarkably dry month. 75% of the month's rain fell on just three days (1st, 3rd and 27th). When the wind fell to light winds, night temperatures fell to freezing and some gardeners in the more sheltered spots experienced night frosts, damaging early-planted crops. There was spell of exceptionally warm weather over the Easter holiday (the warmest Easter weekend for some years).

The weather over the first four days was generally unsettled and cold. There were blustery showers, some falling as hail, on the 1st which was the wettest day of the month. Snow had begun to fall by the 3rd, and was lying to a depth of 2 cm by the morning observation. This melted quickly during the course of the day although the snow showers continued into the 4th. As pressure began to rise, warmer air was brought in from the south/south east and daytime temperatures rose steadily over the following two weeks, although there were night frosts under the clear skies. There was a widespread hoar frost early on the 11th. The warm air from the continent was relatively rainless and no rain fell between the 7th and 23rd. It did, however, import moisture from the North Sea which brought spells of very murky weather.

By the 19th (Good Friday) the daytime temperature had topped 20 degC here in Haydon Bridge and in contrast to 2018, the Easter weekend was sunny and warm, breaking temperature records widely across the UK. The highest

temperature reached in Haydon Bridge was 23.1 degC on the 20th. Much cooler Polar air arrived late on the 22nd and the remainder of the month was much cooler and also less settled. Although March was a notably wetter month than average the total rainfall over the last 12 months or more has been well below average and there is little long-term storage of water in the ground. The grass has been eaten by ewes and lambs and there is now a likelihood of a shortage of grass for silage.

After 'Graham' last month, the British Isles were again hit by another named storm, Hannah, on April 26th. Who names the storms? In the case of Hannah it was the Irish Met Service as it affected largely the Irish Republic and the western side of mainland Britain.


