PARISH COUNCIL NOTES **JANUARY**

MEETING OF HAYDON PARISH COUNCIL AT 7PM ON 24th OF JANUARY 2019, AT HAYDON BRIDGE COMMUNITY CENTRE.

Present: Cllrs J. Bates, I. Burrows, E. Charlton, E. Faulks, A. Kirsopp, K. Richardson, A. Sharp, R. Snowdon, J. Thompson and D. Thornhill; C. McGivern (mins.), and public.

- 1. Public participation -
- a. It was noted that the church clock was accurate.
- b. Mrs Brown wondered if the plaques on the war memorial could be cleaned. Cllr Charlton explained that in other parishes it had been found to be better not to draw attention to the brass on the memorial.
- c. Mrs Brown asked if anything was going to be done about the pavements on Church Street. Cllr Sharp confirmed that they had been inspected and some work issued. It would not be possible to replace all of the flagstones.
- d. The drains at the monument and up North Bank have still not been cleared.
- 2. Apologies were received from Cllr Fletcher who had also submitted her resignation. It was decided to wait to co-opt someone to fill the existing vacancy until the PC is given permission to co-opt for this place too.
- 3. Declarations of interest Cllrs Faulks and Thornhill declared an interest in the planning application regarding 3 Station Cottages.
- 4. Minutes of the previous meeting having been circulated, were agreed and signed with one correction. At point 12 they should have said that NCC and not EA with regard to a tree in the river.
- 5. Report from Northumberland County Council -

The bus stop and timetable are now in place outside the

Community Centre. Yellow lines have been removed at the cemetery. Cllr Sharp had circulated an update about the High School. NCC is contributing £6 million to refurbish the school and pupil numbers have increased. A new IEB is in place and there is a new Deputy Head. Cllr Charlton said that Darren Glover sent his apologies as he had planned to attend the meeting himself. Potholes on the Ridley Hall road are due to be repaired. The road near Castle Farm will also be repaired. Roads around Langley will be repaired. The remaining orange street lights will be repaired in the next couple of months. Cllr Sharp thought that the bulbs would be replaced in the heritage street lights. Tim Fish had provided an update about Spa Well. The delay was due to issues with the land owner. Litter problems continue on the Langley road and between Esp Hill and Threepwood. Cllr Charlton said that Northumberland Day event did not make money for the village and the PC could not continue with it if they were charged for the road closure. The requested extra bus stop at Innerhaugh will be looked at.

6. Highways -

- The Clerk will contact Karbon Homes and ask them to repair a broken seat at Greenwich Gardens.
- Cllr Sharp said that he could not use his member's b. allowance to fund a finger post for the village. He is investigating other sources of funding.
- The Clerk had received a quote for installing a new bin at the Showfield. This was agreed.
- d. Cllr Kirsopp asked if it was possible to get granite strips on the road at the Showfield. Others suggested build outs to narrow the road. Cllr Sharp will investigate.
- Bellway had instructed a contractor to carry out remedial work to the bankside on Lands End Road.
- 7. Lighting nothing to report.
- 8. Planning applications -

18/04520/FUL: Change of use of two rooms of residential property back to its original retail use. The business is a watch and clock repairers, small gift shop and watch and clock museum. The proposed change of use for the front of the property is for a combined A1 and D1 use at 2 Ratcliffe Road - The Parish Council fully supports this application, on the understanding that as advised the front door opens inwards rather than outwards into the street.

18/04536/FUL: Proposed loft conversion: hip to gable roof modification at 8 John Martin Street - no objections.

18/03622/FUL : Construction of single storey side extension at 3 Station Cottages – no objections.

9. Accounts -As in budget.

Victim Support Grant – Victim Support no longer operate in Northumberland. It was agreed to stop grant to Victim Support.

10. Correspondence –

- a. In their last update the EA had said that they planned another public meeting in the "New Year". The Clerk is chasing this up to find out what is planned.
- b. Cllr Charlton said that flooding had been discussed at a meeting regarding plans to demolish garages at Greenwich Gdns and build new houses. A representative of NCC admitted that they had not realised that flooding was such an issue for Haydon Bridge. The waterway from Peelwell down toward the railway was not on their plans and this would be altered.

11. Parish projects -

Development Trust/Bridge - Cllr Charlton said the a. stone signs were still being created. There had been a meeting to discuss work at the riverside. Kerry from the Tyne Rivers Trust had come to the meeting and agreed to advise. A tree surgeon will advise on the condition of the trees. Although some clearing would be done, other areas must be left as wildlife habitat and Kerry will advise on this. It is hoped to improve amenity and increase views to the river without destroying habitat. Peter Fletcher will talk to John Wardle about the supply of large stones to stop people driving over the grass. Some trees had recently been lopped at a height of about 15 foot. The Clerk will contact NW to ask if they are responsible.

12. Any other business -

a. A planned meeting with David English to discuss the Neighbourhood Plan had been postponed as several steps need to be taken before this goes ahead. The group planned to involve the High School and Cllrs Charlton and Snowdon had met with the Head of the High School. The Head plans to speak to students about getting involved. It was felt that the students could help with the public consultation and setting up questionnaires. Cllr Bates has agreed to be project leader for the initial work and then Carol Price will take over after that. Cllr Bates explained that a grant could not be applied for until the public consultation data had been collected. A dummy meeting at the High School was planned, as well as looking at the work produced in Acomb. Cllr Bates said that the plan needed to be very focused and other issues in the village could be addressed in other ways. The Clerk confirmed that £1000 had been set aside.

- b. Cllr Burrows said that there were very few dropped kerbs at Strothers Close. Cllr Sharp will look at this.
- c. Cllr Thompson said that volunteers taking down Christmas lights people had been appalled by the amount of dog fouling on the old bridge and nearby. Cllr Charlton said that there was a box of poo bags in the library for anyone who wanted some. It was agreed to raise this with the dog warden.
- d. Cllr Thompson said that Mr Scanlon had looked at the trees on the riverbank behind Ratcliffe Road. These are between the ginnel beside Mr Jeffs' house to just before the Havelock. It was agreed that the Clerk would contact the EA.
- e. Cllr Kirsopp said that the footpath east of the village to the Spa Well is obstructed by branches. The Clerk will contact Roadlink.

Cllr Thompson agreed to take over the hanging baskets and she will liaise with Vera Fletcher.

Cllr Richardson agreed to assist Cllr Thornhill with the Haydon Bridge Matters Facebook page.

PREPARATION IS THE NAME OF THE GAME

This edition of the *Haydon News* a copy of a PERSONAL FLOOD PLAN., see pages 9 & 10

In 2015 the village and environs was hit by Storm Desmond causing widespread flooding resulting in 36 properties being damaged. These included Lipwood Well, Middle Lipwood, Brigwood, Riverside Workshop, Martins Close, Rocksprings Crescent and the Football Club.

Following this damaging event a Community Flood Group was set up producing a Community Flood Plan, with assistance from the Environment Agency.

This plan lays out what to do if flooding is possible, during a flood and afterwards. It is managed by eleven volunteer FLOOD WARDENS each of whom has an area of responsibility and who can be contacted should an incident occur. In times of flooding a limited supply of sand bags and sand is available. These can be found in GREEN BINS in five locations around the village namely Innerhaugh, Brigwood, Reading Rooms, Martins Close and the Haydonian Club. There are also bins at Lipwood just off the A69.

It should be noted that the sand in the YELLOW BINS is for use on the roads when icy. The sand in the GREEN BINS is for flooding purposes. Northumberland County Council replenishes the sand in YELLOW BINS but not the GREEN BINS. Further sand and bags have to be paid for out of Parish funds. Northumberland County Council do not provide sandbags direct to residents in the event of flooding.

It is possible that there will be a drop-in session in the near future when the Environment Agency and hopefully Northumbrian Water will be on hand to talk about Haydon Bridge's issues.

HOME FRONT 1939 - 1945

I continue my Notes on events in Haydon Parish, from June 1945. Second World War victory for the allies had been achieved in Europe in May 1945, although, the War continued until August/September 1945 in the Far East.

Chapel Social: Recently returned local Prisoners of War, their friends and members of the services home on leave were entertained at a social evening at Haydon Bridge Methodist Church in June 1945. The congregation had held them in thought and prayer continuously during the War and were now ready to offer face to face thanks and congratulations on their safe return. At the same time, they didn't forget 'absent friends' and gave thanks for the contribution they had made to Victory in Europe.

Robert Davison: The funeral of eighty two year old Mr. Robert Davison of Lough Green, Langley, took place on July 11th 1945. Mr. Davison was a well known and noted breeder of Shorthorn cattle and Leicester sheep. He was born at Light Birks and had farmed at Lough Green for twenty nine years before his death. The service was held in Langley Methodist Church. (The descendants of Robt. Davison continue to farm Lough Green today, of course.)

Howay the Lads: Haydon Bridge Football Club agreed to join the West Tyne Football Leauge, revived following the war. The teams expected to compete along with Haydon Bridge included: Acomb Welfare, Allendale, East Park, Corbridge, Hexham Hearts, Mickley, Newbrough and Prudhoe.

Eventually, it was agreed to combine the West Tyne and Ryton & District Leagues for the 1945/46 season and fourteen clubs were expected to take part.

In the Dark: It was reported to the Parish Council in July 1945, that street lighting in Haydon Bridge would not be restored until September.

Drink to Victory: To end the month of July 1945 on a high, tea and sports to which the scholars of Shaftoe



Trust and Grindon schools were invited, were sponsored by Mrs Parker of the General Havelock Hotel. Seventy children in fancy dress took part in a parade headed by the Haydon Bridge Silver Band and Victory Mugs and new sixpences were presented to three hundred and eighty children. (Do you still have your Victory Mug and sixpence? Mine had pride of place in our china cabinet for many years but has been lost in time. And, I think I remember spending the sixpence on sherbet and aniseed balls, at Harding's sweet shop on Church Street.)

Seeing the Light: Haydon Parish Council announced in August 1945 that: 'When the village's new electric street lighting is installed and put into operation, the cost will be a five penny (5d) rate.' The lighting of thirty two gas lights had cost £115 or a three penny (3d) rate but under the proposed scheme thirty three lights would be lit from dusk to midnight, eight months of the year. In addition, the two clock faces on St Cuthbert's Church tower would also be lit. The cost of the street lights was expected to be £150.9s.3d per year and the parish would enter into a ten year agreement with the installers; for the use of, maintenance and electricity supply for the installation. The council informed residents that it had no power to light private streets and, therefore, if those residents in Brigwood required lighting, it would have to be through a private arrangement with the Electric Company.

A Grave Position: The need for a new burial ground at Haydon Bridge was stressed at the August 1945 Haydon Parish Council meeting. The council's, 'burial committee' visited six proposed sites and the council endorsed the committee's choice of a two acre site above the Show Field. It was agreed to approach the Bates' estate to purchase the site which was in their ownership.

'Do you remember the Haydon Bridge Show ...?': When the Haydon Bridge Show was revived after the War, on Saturday, September 1st 1945, the exhibits were staged in Nissen huts that had been erected on the Show Field site during the War; instead of the pre war marquee. There was a big attendance and an excellent number of

entries in the various classes. The supporting attractions

Included two hound trails, a fancy dress parade, and a quoit handicap. Chopwell Colliery Band played for the show-day and a dance was held in the Town Hall at night. General arrangements for the revived show were made by Henry Watson (Secretary) and Thomas Shield (Treasurer).

My history of the Haydon Bridge Show (1841 to 1959) can be found in The Haydon News issues, February 2012 to December 2012.

Victory in Japan (V.J.): On VJ Day (August 15th 1945) and when the Japanese surrendered formally on September 2nd 1945 to end the World War, celebrations in Haydon Parish were muted. The sad memories of the previous six years of conflict were still too close in the thoughts of our residents to consider raucous celebrations. A return to a normal way of life in the village and the parish was, probably, considered adequate celebration in itself.

The end of the War was marked by special services in our churches, and there was a bonfire at Hordley Acres.

Gift Fund: The end of the War signalled the closure of the parish's Local Soldiers' Gift Fund, and a balance of £641 was distributed to all those who had served in any branch of the forces from September 3rd 1939 to August 15th 1945.

A VIEW FROM UP THERE

John Harrison

Travelling in the south of England a while ago I was advised to take the motorway west out of London, which put me in mind of a Tommy Cooper joke – he too was taking the motorway out of London but a policeman pulled him over and told him to put it back.

January was settled and relatively mild and dry for the first two weeks but unsettled weather took over for the latter half of the month. Overall very dry and cooler than average. The wind was from W/NW for 70% of days.

Atmospheric pressure was very high for the first eleven days and the wind was dominantly from between west and north-west.. Although there was relatively little rain over this period, the weather was frequently cloudy and very dull, with mist and fog at times. Less settled weather arrived on the 13th as complex low pressure systems assumed control of the weather. The arrival of cold polar air was marked on the 13th with strong winds and blustery snow showers. The weather was considerably fresher with improved visibility but as the cloud cover cleared, night temperatures began to fall to well below freezing. Air and/or grass-surface frost occurred every night bar one (26th) between the 17th and the end of the month. The air had travelled from arctic latitudes and conditions were very raw at times. On the morning of the 23rd low temperatures accompanied fog, coating vegetation with white ice crystals which sparkled under a blue sky when the fog cleared. On the morning of the 31st the temperature had fallen to -7.0 degC, the lowest of the winter so far, and there was condensation in the form of minute ice crystals which gave an almost magical quality. In my youth we used to call this 'moondust'. The first signs of serious winter snow arrived over the last couple of days which left a significant snow cover to start the next month

The long-term lack of rainfall is a cause for increasing concern and the ground has not yet recovered from the drought of summer 2018. Over the months May

It cost £1500 and was paid for through fundraising. Sandra Brough started off the fundraising with a grand raffle. Prizes were donated from friends, members of the community and local businesses. Sandra spent many hours selling raffle tickets and raised an incredible £800.

In addition to this, financial donations were made from Haydon Bridge United Football Club, Bowls Club, The Get It Together Society and Haydon Bridge. Pharmacy. Plus donations made at events at the Social Club and other smaller personal donations which were much With all of the kind donations and appreciated. fundraising however, there was not enough to purchase the defibrillator.

Then the Tynedale Lions Club stepped in and generously made a large donation. Now that the target had been

reached the Social Club committee were able to purchase the defibrillator and have it installed at no further expense. Stephen Carruthers a trained Fire Brigade officer gave up his spare time to give two free training sessions which were attended by 24 people.

Defibrillators are very easy to use. The audio instructions are very clear. It does help if you can do C.P.R. at the same time.

With the installation of this defibrillator at the Haydonian Social Club, we now have 3 defibrillators in the village, which are accessible 24 hours a day.

There will be a further course at 10am Sat 9th March. We are open to any donations in the future to help with the maintenance of the village's defibrillators. Many thanks to the Club committee and all who helped to add another life-saver to the village.

FINE TEXTILES MEET FINE ART

Spring may still be round the corner, but The Allendale Forge gallery has a March exhibition entitled JU-MA, which will be a feast for the senses and provide a lift for the spirit. A kaleidoscopic collaboration between fine art and textiles brings together three superbly creative local people, all masters of their chosen discipline.

JU-MA is a collaboration between Julia Neubauer – no stranger to the Allendale Forge and a shop member as 'Chameleon', and Marion Woolcott, incorporating their considerable skills in hand framed knitting and weaving. Through working together as members of The Wool Clip, they were inspired by each other's expertise and JU-MA was born.



As a starting point, the drape and styling of Marion's scarves triggered the Japanese influence of their designs. Initially, they decided to produce kimono style garments using a two tone colourway, with a defined colour



palette, intricate weave patterns and subtle detailing. Both feel strongly that using quality, natural material is essential to their design process.

After experimentation, the two chose fine, Italian spun 100% Merino wool. In developing the project, they have added a colour pop, indigo and origami inspirations, which has led to the production of a range of accessories using their extensive textile knowledge. Every garment is hand-made in their own homes and workshops, and each has its own unique personality; and Julia says: 'Each piece is a wearable work of art.'

Marion produces items using ply split braiding, including bracelets, necklaces, brooches and key rings while Julia also produces a range of bracelets, bags and buttons using Japanese fabrics and embroidery, as well as hand woodblock printed purses.

The third artist exhibiting with JU-MA is printmaker and author/illustrator Ray Ogden, based in Culgaith in the Eden Valley. A graphic design graduate of Liverpool College of Art and the Royal College of Art, he is a former B.B.C. television designer, art director and lecturer at Cumbria Institute of the Arts and Glasgow School of Art.

Ray mixes visual conventions for decorative and creative effect, working with digital, natural media and paint programmes to create playful graphic ideas. Stylised bird and animal motifs feature frequently, reflecting his interest in indigenous people's art forms and the aesthetic of the Japanese print. While accepting occasional illustration commissions, Ray now concentrates on adding to his range of limited edition prints and children's book projects.

The JU-MA exhibition opens in the Allendale Forge Gallery on Friday 1st March until the end of the month. Admission is free - as is adjacent parking - and there is an all day Cafe in the Forge.
