PARISH COUNCIL PICKINGS

The last meeting took place on 25th July. There was no meeting in August.

Eight out of the current compliment of ten councillors attended.

So did County Councillor D Gibson.

Elections: No public demand was made for a bye-election for a Parish Councillor. It is now up to the existing Council to co-opt another member. They decided to wait and see if the new District Councillor (for which job there is to be an election) will want to serve on the Parish as well.

<u>ROADS</u>: Cllr Gibson saidthat there were some indications that the by-pass question has not been completely shelved by the Ministry. Haltwhistle Town Council is making great efforts to lobby concerned, and Cllr Waite offered to see whether their efforts could be supported (to our advantage as well) by Haydon Bridge, Meanwhile it is said that traffic counts do not indicate that the improvement at Greenhead has increased the traffic flow.

PARISH PICKINGS CONT

As for the improvement at "Watsons Garage", this seems to have got lost down the back of some filing cabinet. Cllr Gibson will try to find out where.

In Church St, the councillors have had a look at the Post Office corner, and agreed to ask the County to extent the pedestrian barrier outside the Railway Hotel to coincide with the end of the Double Yellow Lines, and thus discourage parking which can be very obstructive, even for a short period.

Church Street Trees: In a typical local government set-up, the trees are owned by the County and maintained by the District for the benefit of the Parish. The District is quite willing to alter the lopping system, or even replace the trees with something more decorative. Cllr Waite promised to try to discover who would be footing the bill and what sort of expense would be involved in these suggestions. Nevertheless, the Council is not altogether confident that it knows what the general opinion about the trees is. If you have a view on the subject please make it known to a Parish Councillor or to the Clerk.

Planning permission: has been sought for another bungalow on the Heugh House Lane site.

Financial support to Haydon Bridge Community Association of £560 and to Langley Village Hall of £190 was approved.

Cllr Waite described the sewerage problem at Brigwood. In spite of the unpleasantness for the residents, it was agreed to say thank-you to the District Council men who arrived promptly and worked for two days to get it cleared. The Water Authority will receive a copy to remind them that the system is now their responsibility.

SALMON

With all the salmon being caught here is a little recipe to make a change of a fish meal.

SALMON CUTLETS

INGREDIENTS

4 neat cutlets of fresh salmon

juice of I leman

20z butter
2 tablespoon
chopped par

2oz butter 2 tablespoons white wine chopned parsley

METHOD .

Butter a fireproof dish, place the fish in it, side by side and sprinkle lemon juice and wine over. Cover with buttered paper and cook for 20 minutes in a moderate oven. Meanwhile peel and cube the cucumber and boil in slightly salted water till tender Strain, arrange in a border on a hot serving dish and place the cutlets, when ready in the centre, Strain the liquid from the fish over and sprinkle parsley on top of the cucumber.

OLD SPECTACLES FOR THE THIRD WORLD Dear Mr Todd

The idea of my recent trip to Tanzania was conceived by an American optometrist-Dr Russ Dorland from Minnesota. A voluntary team from America and the U.K. of 40 optometrists and helpers met at Heathrow and flew out to Dares Salaam along with 30,000 pairs of old spectacles. The Lions Club of Tanzania had organised all accommodation etc. So that all we had to do was divide our party between four locations, Dar Es Salaam, Dodoma, Moshi and Arusha and get on with the job. I was sent to Moshi, along with three other optometrists and three helpers to dispense Glasses, which is a large town about 20 milesfrom the base of Kilimanjaro.

Our first days work gave us some idea of the enormous demand for spectacles. In all we tested 2,700 people in 4½ days. A similar number was completed in each of the other locations. So that a total of II,000 spectacles were given out.

This may seem a large number, but in fact it was a drop in the ocean compared with the demand. There are many problems in providing glasses in Tanzania which are all linked to their weak currency. They cannot afford to build a lens or frame manufacturing industry, but have to rely almost entirely on voluntary contributions such as those given by the Haydon Bridge community.

All in all, it was a very enjoyable and enlightening experience.
