

#### PARISH COUNCIL PICKINGS

#### 26th SEPTEMBER 1985

Nine out of ten serving Councillors present. In accordance with the decision taken at a previous meeting the new district Councillor (our Editor Mrs Marion Howard) was invited to join as a co-opted member. She accepted, so that made ten out of eleven.

Once again, the greater part of the meeting was devoted to highway matters, four questions being raised on behalf of the Friends by your reporter. Other members of the public left the Council in no doubt about their dissatisfaction at the complete lack of progress in finding an answer to the problem of the Ratcliffe road back lane. Councillor Waite recited a history of District Council diliberations on the subject going back to 1979. Bringing the road upto a state in which the County would adopt it was estimated to cost £17,500 in 1980. Tynedale could not afford it then, and are even less able to do so now, and in any case will not move while the Ratcliffe Road homeowners are not prepared to bear the cost for that part of the roadway which belongs to them. Clearly, some more radical approved to the problem will be needed.

Councils and Government continue to swap correspondence on the by-pass but nothing visible can be said to be happening. The best the Departme of Transport could produce was an undertakingngo look into ways of "improving the situation" where the road passes through the residentia areas. (Triple Glazing?)

We are informed that Eylish Industrial Estate Ltd made us promises about making up the lane to Railway Cottages (another private road). The pavement outside Marsh's shop will be looked at, North Bank, below Toft Hill Cottage, where drainage work has been carried out, will almost certainly be tidied up in due course.

At the Allendale road junction (Watson's Garage) the NCC surveyors have found unforseen problems with the ground-so its back to the drawing board.

Brigwood's problems are receiving attention. The water company is considering what it can do about brown water and waste authority is contemplating the sub-standard sewers.

#### Neighbourhood Watch

There is to be a public meeting at 7.30 pm on 8th October in the Community Centre to discuss the proposed Scheme covering North Bank and Belmont etc. These Schemes have been very successful in reducing small crime elsewhere, and police representation will be on hand to explain and answer questions.

#### Charlote Straker Hospital Corbridge

Mrs Howard has been deputed to represent the village on a proposed Save - the - Hospital Committee.

It looks as if the Northumberland Theatre Company will continue to survive for another year. The Parish Council made a further donation of £25 but the best way to keep them in business is for people to turn up at their performances, which everybody says are spendidly well done.

### DRAUGHT PROOF ING

To claim a single payment from the DHSS which covers the full cost of materials, you must be in receipt of, or eligible for, either Supplementary Benefit or Supplementary Pension and have less than £500 savings.

We also offer draughtproofing at the cost of materials only to the elderly, disabled, single parent families and those on a low income.

#### LOFT INSULATION CONTINUED

Grants are available from your  $L^O$ cal Authority. To qualify for your grant there must be no existing insulation or no more than 30 mm (I") in any part of your loft also your home must have been built before 1975.

The two rates of grant are:

90% GRANT - you must be a pensioner receiving Housing Benefit (Rent or Rates Rebate), or on a Supplementary Pension. You may qualify if anyone im your household receives an attendance allowance or moblity allowance - even if they are below pensionable age. The Home Insulation Grant will 90% of the cost up to a maximum of £95.

66% GRANT- anyone under pensionable age qualifies for this grant. The Home Insulation Grant will be 66% of the cost up to a maximum of £69.

# CONGRATULATIONS to MR. RALPH PICKERING of Langley Farm Cottage.

On Friday Oct. 11th, as part of their Golden Jubilee celebrations, the National Association of Boys' Clubs are having a special dinner at which they will present NABC Keystone Awards to persons who have made a major contribution to the work of the Northumberland Association during the past 50 years. Mr. Pickering has been invited to receive his special Golden Jubilee Award personally.

This will be his second, the first being for over 30 years' service in the Northumberland area and presented in 1979.

Mr. Pickering started his first boys' club at Langley Reading Room in 1947 and this was affiliated a year later. In the 1950s he took over the HB club at the Community Centre. The work here was voluntary and run and financed by the boys themselves until affiliation with the LEA in the 1970s.

He has seen a number of his boys go on to success in adult life and has found his work with the clubs both interesting and rewarding.

Now semi-retired due to ill health, Ralph Pickering still retains an interest in local youth, his last club being at Bardon Mill.
