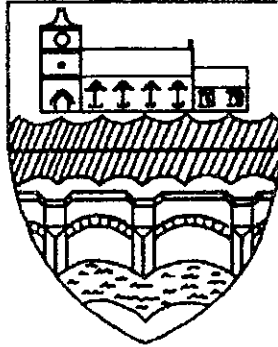

PARISH PICKINGS.

Meetings of 28th
November and 21st
December.

If it seems odd that the November meeting does not get reported until the January/February issue, let me offer an explanation. The original schedule for the issue that you received just before Christmas had the typesetting finished too early to include the report. Then we had a problem about turning the six typeset pages into 4,800 printed copies. So we were in your home 3 weeks later than we had intended. Sorry.

November.

First of all welcome to our Parish Council to our new resident Policeman. As a newcomer to the village he wants you to talk to him about anything you see that could be of concern to yourself or the village. Do see him as an ally in keeping the area a civilised and peaceable place to live.

About half a dozen residents from the area of Wood Hall came to lodge objections to the proposed foundary in the old Land Army buildings. They produced well documented arguments that the proposed activity would result in fumes, dust and noise; it would also require storage of flammable materials, and might create more traffic than the road layout could reasonably handle in safety. The Parish Council agreed to pass on these concerns to the Planning Committee.

Under the new Community Charge, the Parish no longer gets its own rate in the £1, but has to specify to Tynedale District Council the sum of money which it expects to spend on your behalf in the year. It was agreed to put in for the same amount as was raised by the Parish Rate last year. This will provide a sensible margin for the unexpected.

The December Meeting opened with congratulations to Cllr Mrs M Porteous

in reaching her eightieth birthday while still a member of the council. It was also noted that Mr B Waite had reached the same age. Some of the Younger councillors have a lot to look forward to!

There is some possibility that work may be done in improving the 'Watson's Garage' junction during 1990-but this was equally true in 1989.

You will no doubt be aware that Hexham General Hospital celebrates its Golden Jubilee this year. Arising out of this, it has been decided to make an appeal for a sum of £150,000 to purchase an ultrasonic scanner and a suite in which to house it.

Ultrasound examination employs the use of sound waves outside the range of the human ear. These sound waves traverse bodily tissues, rebounding off solid organs and so demonstrating their size and shape.

The technique is safe with minimum discomfort and is now extensively used as a diagnostic aid in medicine. It is invaluable in obstetrics and in other forms of heart disease, in addition to its wide use in abnormal conditions.

We believe that the generous support of local communities for this project will act as a further indicator to the Planning Committee, currently reviewing hospital services in Tynedale.

It will also serve to emphasise public opinion, that a Full District Hospital Service should be maintained and enhanced in Hexham.

We should be glad if local organisations would consider setting in train some fund-raising activity to lend support.

If you feel it would be of help to have a speaker to give you further information, I should be happy to arrange this.

BERLIN & EASTERN EUROPE

Report from Brussels by
Dr. Gordon Adam, Euro MP for Northumbria.

European issues are strongly to the fore at this time and the political earthquake in Eastern Europe and Berlin is one of them. Willy Brandt, the former West German Chancellor and Foreign Minister, who was Mayor of West Berlin at the time of the erection of the Berlin Wall in 1961, addressed the Socialist Group in the European Parliament in November 1989 on the subject of these recent events. Willy Brandt described recent events as the end of communist bureaucratic state domination of power. The separate parts of Europe were moving together again, so that Prague and Budapest and other cities would henceforth play a full European role. He warned that, as with all historical processes, there would be setbacks; it would be remarkable if it were otherwise. It was impossible to guess how far the political pendulum would swing. The previous Friday, when he had visited Berlin, had been the most moving day of his life. The revolution taking place was not only bloodless but, unusually cheerful and merry. It was not just a story about Germany but part of a wider European process and there had to be a European response. To loud applause he declared that all the dominant political parties in West Germany were not contemplating a slowing down of European unification, rather, they would like to see this extended outwards. A month earlier Brandt had had a long private meeting with President Gorbachev and he was convinced of his honest intentions. He had not become a Social Democrat but he was not a Bolshevik either. He is facing up to the enormous challenge of economic modernisation and Brandt was firm that the West does not stand to gain from any failure by Gorbachev. "We must wish him well."

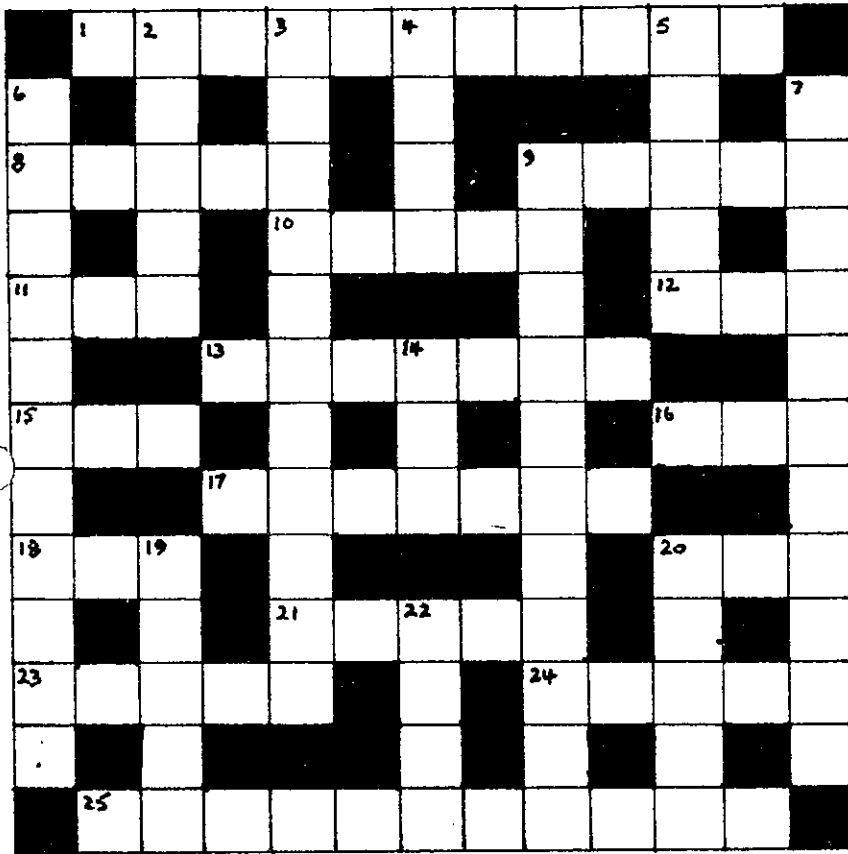
