

COMMUNITY USE OF HIGH SCHOOL FACILITIES

I am delighted to be able to write to you about the opportunities which are available for the local community at the High School. The large Sports Hall is available for hire during an evening, at weekends and during school holidays. Both organised and selfprogramming activities can be catered for, whether it be cricket, basketball, football, badminton or whatever. There are also the two Squash Courts where, at last, we intend to repaint the walls and to refurbish the floor. For outdoor enthusiasts, there are four tennis courts to enjoy as the nets are not removed at all during the summer months. I am always pleased to see families and children using this facility during an evening or at a week-end. At the cricket ground, the time and money spent by both the Cricket Club and the School have furthewr enhanced provision for this splendid game. The Cricket Club welcomes new members in both Junior and Senior sections.

As well as these active sports, there is also a full range of community classes for both young and old. At the moment, teenagers can enjoy, through the Youth Club or the Boarding Wings, climbing, wind-surfing, fishing or canoeing. Furthermore, the programme of classes for the Autumn Term is now prepared and will include such gems as Fishing and Fly Tying, Practical Printma-

king, Cake Decorating and Sugarcraft, Woolcrafts, Persian Cookery, Karate, Gardeners' Question Time, Embroidery and Needlecrafts, Floral Art and Associated Crafts, General Art Class and Relax......

As well as these, any adult can join classes held at school during the day, whether they be General Certificate of Secondary Education or Advanced Level. In addition, there are the more vocational classes in Business and Finance and, from September, in Nursing and Caring Services.

Should you be interested in any of these, telephone the School and talk to Miss Barbara Mansfield, Deputy Head, Mr Steve O'Mara, Community Tutor, or Miss Lesley Robson, Community Secretary (Community Department Tel No 684456, School Tel No 684422). Do join in - or suggeat how we might improve our provision even further by making positive suggestions to the Community Department.

On the subject of being positive, I should like to enlist your support in helping to keep the School neat and tidy. Please do not walk any dogs on the School Grounds, as apart from the obvious sight and smell, there is always the health hazard to those enjoying outdoor sport. I should also be grateful if children would not use the School grounds as a bicycle track, as damage is being done to the grassed areas. The tarmac areas between the main entrance and the School buildings is much more sensible and safer

than the orchard, the shrubberies and the bank side.

Let us all use the School and its facilities as they should be used - as a community learning together.

PARISH COUNCIL PICKINGS Meeting of 27 June 1991

6 Councillors present 2 members of the public

The Chairman welcomed Mrs Eileen Charlton and Mrs Joan Ferguson as co-opted members.

The public presence was concerned about conditions in and around Martin's Close. There were complaints about litter on the Waterside, but the Chairman, whose land it is, was not prepared to take any personal responsibility for rectifying misuse by the general public who have free access to it. There is possibility that some Tynedale will repair the wall at the bottom of the Close, in which case the gate can be re-hung, thus making it more difficult for drivers to race out of the car park. . There was also a suggestion that that there ought to be a zebra or "lollipop lady" for the children crossing to go to the First School, but this has already been firmly sat on by the Highway Authority. (and there is, after all, an underpass).

The District and County Councils and the River Authority have been busy re-defining their respective areas of responsibility for the river bank. What is tipped there is under the control of the County, but it seems that, as far as the River Authority is concerned, the present activity is doing nothing useful to protect the bank. That would need a proper rampart of big boulders, properly bedded in. Maybe the County will take note of this opinion and consider

some further action.

that the pedestrian barriers on the north side of Shaftoe Street needed re-painting brought an offer simply to remove them! The Parish Council did not think much of this idea, given the more or less permanent traffic congestion in the street, and asked for reconsideration. A survey has been made of all the public seats - many of them in various states of disrepair - with a view to concentrating attention on those sites where they are actually used. Some will not be replaced, so if you have a particular affection for some place where you can rest

handicapped in other ways with a "Club" that can be a social centre that can provide other interests and activities in combination with school activities.

The club will meet once a week in the school YOUTH HUT, a comfortable, warm and roomy "temporary" classroom near the woodwork room at the school and will contain a billiard table, dartboard and tables for dominoes.

Lunch and tae will be provided and speakers with slides and film-shows arranged from time to time. Perhaps the most exciting part of the venture will be the role that it is envisaged the High School will play.

Reynolds of Age Concern is the School Development Liaison Co-ordinator and she will be developing facilities to enable members of the club to join in school activities, e.g. woodwork, metalwork, painting, history etc so that club meetings will not be a gathering of the same old (!) faces week after week but will provide club members with more variety, interest and stimulation as well as providing a closer understanding between young and old.

Initially the club will be "run" by Mrs Reynolds (as above) and Mrs J Marshall, the Rural Development Officer of Age Concern and the idea will be launched at an open coffee morning at Haydon Bridge High School on Thursday 12th September at 10.30 am.

I hope that a large number of people will come to that meeting, whether they intend to join the club or not, and I should like to have the names of as many volunteer drivers and interested

people as possible. Ring the Surgery.

I feel this could be a very exciting and worthwhile project and would like to feel, it will be well supported.
